and did many other jobs to repair and improve our church building and radio station. In the school building, they installed a ceiling in our last classroom and worked on our new bathroom block. On top of all that, they preached some great messages and encouraged us all through great fellowship.

Our sound system and more radio station equipment arrived!

The same day we blessed the Bibles, we tried out our mixer/amp, microphones, lapel mikes, and speakers. They all worked well and we only have a little tweaking to do to perfect things. This will help us record services to broadcast through the radio station. Now that we have everything here, we will concentrate in April on getting the radio station running continuously. I expect to have more news on that in next month's letter.
